History

Founded in 2001, Thurgood Marshall Academy Public Charter High School (TMA) prepares students to succeed in college and to actively engage in our democratic society. Through a rigorous standards-based curriculum, uncompromisingly high expectations for student performance and behavior, and pedagogy modeled on the democratic ideals of fairness, participation, and respect for diverse perspectives, students are empowered to make a difference in their communities and to succeed in life. In SY 16-17 Thurgood Marshall Academy enrolls a total of 400 students in grades 9 through 12. **Our student body is 99% African-American and 1% Hispanic.**

School and Local Community

Thurgood Marshall Academy is located in Southeast, Washington, D.C. in the historic Anacostia neighborhood. Our student population primarily resides in Wards 7&8 where less than 10% of the residents hold a Bachelor's Degree. **Nearly 85% of our student population is on free or reduced lunch and 88% are first-generation college students.** As an open-enrollment charter school, we enroll a significant number of our incoming freshmen with math and reading skills below grade level. With our 90-minute double block Math and English classes in 9th & 10th grade, 90% improve their skills and become proficient by 10th grade in preparation for higher level Honors and Advanced Placement courses in 11th & 12th grades.

Faculty & Staff

Thurgood Marshall Academy has 34 full time faculty and staff where 100% are ranked Highly Qualified with more than 70% earning higher degrees. The average faculty to student ratio is 15:1. We have one full time college counselor and a college and alumni associate.

*All students are required to complete and pass an annual graded portfolio. Students have until senior year to make up unsuccessful portfolio attempts.

Grade Scale

When calculating GPA, a .5 weight is added to final GPA value for Honors courses and 1.00 point weight added to final GPA value for AP and DE courses. The lowest grade a student can earn is a C-. 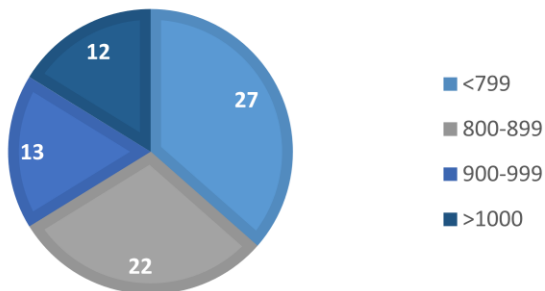

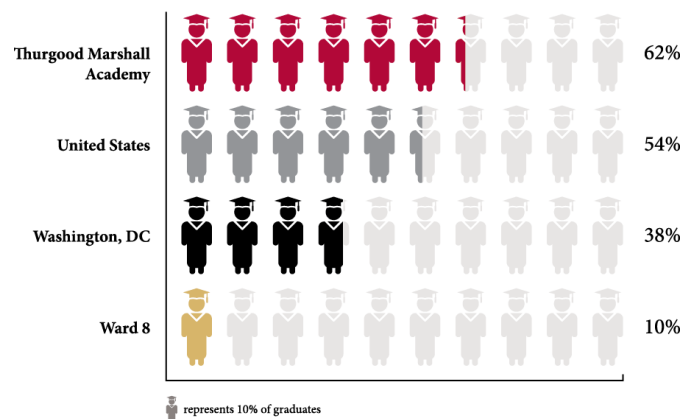
